SUBJECT: **May 2006, CAT Team Recap**

During the month of May, 2006, the San Dimas Community Action Team handled four (4) assigned cases. One case involved the forgery of checks in which CAT team members proved the suspect was the victim's son, who is currently on parole. The case was later filed with the District Attorney's office.

The Team made a total of twenty seven (27) arrests during the month. The arrests ranged from drug possession to parole violations.

The CAT Team also assisted the following Departmental units and outside agencies; Assisted California State parole in arresting five (5) parole violators and recovered three firearms. Assisted San Dimas Code Enforcement Officer, David Shono at 733 Oakway, San Dimas, concerning occupancy violations. Assisted San Dimas Station Detective Bureau in serving a search warrant and the arrest of a suspect wanted for attempt murder. Assisted the Sheriff's Department Metro Vice team at a massage and acupuncture center where two persons were arrested. Assisted the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) in a probation search of a residence in San Dimas, where the resident was suspected of receiving fraudulently prescribed drugs. Assisted the Sheriff's Narcotics crew with the service of several search warrants. Two suspects were arrested and illegal narcotics were recovered.

The Cat Team completed a Traffic Safety Check Point on Arrow Highway/ Walnut Avenue. A total of 2,492 vehicles passed through the check point, with twenty-five (25) citations being issued and three arrests being made, one for possession of illegal narcotics. Thirteen vehicles were towed

On June 30, the CAT Team completed a "Crosswalk Sting" at three locations in the downtown area of San Dimas. A total of fifty-one (51) citations were issued for failure to yield to a pedestrian, eight (8) citations issued for speed, one (1) citation issued for expired license and two (2) citations issued for child restraint violations.

The School Resource Officer made three arrests for "habitual truancy," two arrests for sales of marijuana and one arrest for possession of marijuana on school grounds.

SUBJECT: **May 2006 Detective Bureau Recap**

During the month of May 2006, San Dimas Detective Bureau completed 192 cases. Seventy three of those cases involved reported missing or runaway minor children.

Due to several recent residential burglaries in the Via Verde area, detectives conducted a probation search at known burglars' residence, who lived in that same area. The suspect was not at location and no evidence was recovered in the home, however while returning to the San Dimas Sheriff's Station, the suspect was observed driving on San Dimas Avenue near Arrow Highway. Since we had knowledge that the suspect's driver's license was suspended, we conducted a traffic stop of the suspect's truck. He was taken into custody for the vehicle code violation and a probation violation. Further investigation resulted in the arrest of two additional suspects for narcotic violations.

Investigating the theft of a credit card from a residence in San Dimas, detectives conducted a probation search of a residence located in Winnetka. The suspect was identified, arrested and felony charges were filed at Pomona Court.

Detectives prepared and served a search warrant at a residence in the City of Covina for a suspect wanted for felony assault. The suspect was safely taken into custody. During the interview, the suspect admitted to the crime.

Detective's conducted an educational presentation at the Citizen's Academy explaining the role of a station detective.

During a traffic stop by a patrol deputy, a suspect was arrest for possession of illegal narcotics. The search of the car led to the recovery of several hundred documents, which contained personal information which could be used for identity theft. As a result of the followup investigation by detectives, it was learned that the items had been stolen in two separate burglaries, one in the city of La Verne and the city of Claremont.

### IDENTITY THEFT

March 2006

Someone wants to use your name and identifying information to obtain goods, services, credit, and even open fraudulent bank accounts. Identity thieves have targeted virtually every community, and unfortunately, any one of us could be their next victim.

Identity theft is difficult to prevent because it's usually not spotted until after the crime has been committed. Be careful. When using a bank card, cover the hand that is typing in your **secret code**, (with your other hand or a piece of paper, etc.). Use a **shredder** before putting papers with your account numbers in the trash. Don't provide your **Social Security or driver's license number** unless you are certain it is required and are sure who you are giving it to.

If you discover you are a victim of identity theft:

**Law Enforcement.** Report the crime and get a copy of your police report. Keep the report number handy and give it to creditors and others who require verification of your case.

**Credit Bureaus.** Immediately call the fraud units of the three credit reporting companies - Experian, Equifax, and Trans Union. They will flag your accounts. Ask the credit bureaus for the names and phone numbers of credit grantors with whom fraudulent accounts have been opened.

**Creditors.** Contact all creditors immediately with whom your name has been used fraudulently - by phone and in writing. Get replacement cards with new account numbers for your own accounts that have been used fraudulently. Ask that old accounts be processed as "account closed at consumer's request."

**Stolen Checks.** If you have had checks stolen or bank accounts set up fraudulently, report it to the check verification companies. Put stop payments on any outstanding checks that you are unsure of. Cancel your

checking and savings accounts and obtain new account numbers.

**ATM Cards.** If your ATM card has been stolen or is compromised, get a new card, number, and password.

**Fraudulent change of address.** Notify the local Postal Inspector if you suspect an identity thief has filed a change of address with the post office or has used the mail to commit credit or bank fraud.

**Social Security number misuse.** Call the Social Security Administration to report fraudulent use of your social security number.

**Driver License Number misuse.** If someone is using your identification on bad checks, call the state office of the Department of Motor Vehicles to see if another license was issued in your name.
