APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF JANUARY 5, 2010

TRAILS UPDATE

They also requested a booth at the March 27<sup>th</sup> Family Festival and when the Farmers Market opens in April to promote the clean up.

He also reported that next months meeting on March 2<sup>nd</sup> will be last meeting held at City Hall until after the remodel. In the interim meetings will be held in the Senior Citizen / Community Center.

Councilman Templeman reported that the City has received the bids for the Civic Center renovation project and the award of bids will be presented to the City Council at their February 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting. He also reported that the City Council will have their first budget study session on February 9<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Reiss announced that she has recently moved to Norco and since she no longer lives in the City she will need to step down from the Commission. She thanked the Commissioners and said she will still stay involved with the community and the Rodeo.
