- I. Welcome and Call to Order
Meeting called to order by Chair Nash at 5:30 pm.
- II. Business from the public not on the agenda – none
- III. Approval of the July 17, 2012 Minutes – Commissioners absent from the meeting abstained from the approval.
- IV. Sheriff's Department Annual Report – Community Action Team and School Resource Officer

Team Leader White reviewed the statistics of the Community Action Team's work over the past 12 months – 375 Arrests; 165 Citations; 30 Search Operations; 52/47 Cases worked/solved. He said a good deal of time is spent focusing on parolees. He reviewed the following statistics:

Deputy White mentioned that the Department does not conduct vehicle check points anymore because of state legislative action to limit them. He provided information on Special Assignment Graffiti and Gang information – 93 Graffiti incidents and 25 arrests; Gang related incidents were 9 with 14 arrests. Parole/Probation Searches were 27. The CAT has focused on narcotic investigations through probation searches, traffic stops, seizures, and good police work. Deputy White provided a summary of recent cases. The Community Action Team also provides special assignment detail to work with the Station's Detective Bureau, interact with community organization and help with event planning and management, Crime prevention efforts, Review truancy and School Resource Officer Needs, roaming undercover patrols, access and coordination with Department-wide resources, and focusing on parolees at large within our area (10-12,000

in LA County; and 105 in San Dimas). The CAT also works with the city's code enforcement staff as needed.

School Resource Officer Report: 45 arrests, 77 citations, 65 reports taken, 6 probation searches, truancy cases worked/solved 29/29. School Emergency Response plans need to be refreshed each year, Deputy training (including active shooter training at Lone Hill Middle School), Career Day participation at SDHS and Lone Hill, and Red Ribbon Week participation at schools. The SRO assists school staff with: truancy, residency investigation, discipline issues, and counseling students.

The focus of the Station will be to continually keep an eye on parole and probationers. The Commission thanked the Department for the presentation – and expressed appreciation for their work.
